COVID related deaths as of 4/18/20 – 3 deaths (a new line)

I had a question about what staff were Positive with COVID. We currently have 5 nursing staff and 2 Dunwoody at Home aides out with the Virus. We had one from dining who was self - quarantined very early on and was not around food (management team member). He returned on 4/16/20 after being cleared by Dr. Lawrence.

We have been having some issues with wipes being flushed down the toilet. Please only flush toilet paper – we do not want back- ups right now!

Our face mask group has produced over 300 face masks so far. Our next project is to get 2 masks per resident in the care center – that is about 260 total. Currently they have surgical masks, but we really need them for the staff, so Our goal is to make them this week – we are using t-shirt material for the ear loops (softer on the ears) and no pipe cleaner so they can be laundered (the reason for 2 per person).
