Information about debit cards that may have been mailed to you -

From the AARP Website link for the Economic Impact Payments Debit Card:

The IRS has sent 4 million payments by prepaid debit cards, or Economic Impact Payment (EIP) cards, as the Treasury Department has dubbed them. The cards are going out to certain eligible taxpayers who filed tax returns but for whom the IRS doesn't have bank account information. The stimulus payment is loaded on the debit card.

Your EIP card will arrive in a plain envelope from "Money Network Cardholder Services." The Visa name will appear on the front of the EIP card; the back of the card has the name of the issuing bank, MetaBank, N.A. Note that you can't request you receive your stimulus payment by debit card — it either arrives that way or it doesn't.

How to activate your EIP card

Call 800-240-8100 (TTY: 800-241-9100). You'll need to provide your name, address and Social Security number. You will also be asked to create a four-digit personal identification number (PIN) required for ATM transactions and automated assistance and to hear your balance. For security, don't use personal information as your PIN. For cards with more than one name, only the primary cardholder (listed first on the card) may activate the card. There is no charge to activate the card.

You can create a user name and password for your card online, at the Money Network site. Be sure to have your card handy when you log in. You can see your balance and transaction history

online any time at <u>EIPCard.com</u>. You can get the same information by calling the toll-free number.

How to use your EIP card

You can generally use your card without a fee to make purchases anywhere Visa debit cards are accepted — in stores, online or over the phone. You can also use your EIP card to pay most bills, get cash back with a PIN debit purchase (where available), buy groceries and get cash from ATMs that carry the Allpoint brand. You can search for surcharge-free ATMs at EIPCard.com. And you may be able to pay your mortgage or rent, if your bank or landlord accepts Visa payments.

Although <u>most transactions don't charge a fee</u>, a few do. For example, you'll pay 25 cents for each balance inquiry at an ATM, and \$2 for each out-of-network withdrawal after your first one. You'll also pay \$7.50 for a lost or stolen card, and \$17 if you want it shipped to you by priority mail.

I spoke to John Alberici about the condiments and they are going to order prepackaged condiments and put them in the bag – this will start Saturday, so please check the bottom of your bags for the packets. Items that can not be prepackaged will be in cups in the bags – we will try this and see if it works.

The commissary is opening up for lunch for **employees only** starting June 1, 2020. The lunches will be boxed lunches – nothing made to order – and a grab and go style. Lunch tickets will be bought at specific times and tickets will be turned in when buying a meal. We are trying this to see how it works......more to come!

We have been contacted by the county that if you receive your ballot late and do not have time to mail it back, they will be sending a van on election day (Tuesday June 2) to have you drop it off. We are getting more information as to when the van will be here and will pass it along when we know. IF you have not gotten your ballot that you requested, please call and ask them to resend it. You should have gotten it by now. Please call **<u>1-877-868-3772</u>** and if you had requested a mail in ballot and did not get one, they will mail a new ballot out to you.
