## Herb Garden update from Delores Broberg

As for picking, the kale is now ready. Take outer leaves from the bottom of the stalk. Also, please take some leaves from each plant - especially from those which seem to be encroaching on other plants. We have had a dill disaster. The plants are recovering, but will need some time to develop. Taking a few leaves from the basil is O.K. Notice that the garnet basil wants to flower. Those points are edible, tasty and pretty. Please prefer them if you see them.
