Dear Residents, Families, and Staff:

I had the opportunity to dine in the Memorial Garden Tent earlier this week. Despite some rain, it was a great experience with lovely ambiance and delicious food. I was partial to the Cremini and Truffle Mushroom Ravioli and the Tiramisu! Kudos to John Alberici and the Dining Team and Wes Kuehne and the Maintenance Team for working tirelessly to make the dining experience in the tent enjoyable! Please know we continue to “tweak” the process for dining as we roll out these new dining experiences.

**Healthcare Update:**

If residents residing in Skilled Nursing or Personal Care choose to go on an overnight outing or attend a gathering of 10 or more, they will be asked to complete a 7-day quarantine upon return.

Day 0 will begin on the date of return. The resident will also be rapid tested upon return, monitored for symptoms during quarantine and tested again on day 7 and if negative, quarantine will be removed. Please be reminded of potential risks of public settings, particularly if the resident or others have not been fully vaccinated. Please avoid crowds and poorly ventilated spaces, practice physical distancing, wear a mask when needed and perform frequent hand hygiene. If fully vaccinated residents are visiting friends or family in their homes, they should follow the mask and physical distancing recommendations for visiting with others in private settings. Also please advise the shift supervisor immediately if you have had close contact with a person with COVID-19 while outside of Dunwoody.

**Personal Care Update:**

Village Grill: With the tent and Terrace Dining Room both opening, we did not expect the large number of residents using the Village Grill for takeout as experienced Monday night. We are working on a few modifications. Please remember it is a single file line, and please order within

a reasonable time. At the end of the line, exit through the doorway to your left. Please do not turn around to leave from the entrance, and please do not exit through the Terrace Dining Room.

- Motorized scooters are causing congestion in the hallway. Scooters are to be parked below on the first floor. Leave your scooter on the first floor. Take the elevator to the second floor. Exit the elevator outside the Village Grill entrance.

Entering the Memorial Garden Tent: For your safety – when accessing the tent during inclement weather, please use the covered entrance located next to the Village Grill. Do not use the outside sidewalk path located in front of the auditorium.

The Picnic will be held Wednesday June 16. The Bar opens at 4:30 p.m. – Food 5:00 p.m. The Terrace Dining room will be open at 5:30 p.m. for those not attending the Picnic. The Village Grill will be open for To-Go meals at 5:30 p.m. Picnic rain date Thursday June 17.

**Gift Shop:**

Beginning Monday, June 14<sup>th</sup>, the Gift Shop will be open Monday through Friday from 11AM – 2PM. We extend a big “thank you” to our resident volunteers who are helping to keep it open more often now.

**Construction Update:**

On the east side of the project, the roofer has begun to install shingles on the sloped roofs. The framer is finishing up the roof level walls, so that they can be weatherproofed, and the flat roofs can be tied in and the building will be closer to dried in. On the west side of the project, the steel erector is finishing up detailing, and trusses will continue to be set. This will be followed by plywood at the roof level and roof level walls. Inside the building, the mason is working on interior cmu walls, and the framer is setting door frames and beginning to frame walls.

**In Remembrance:**

Due to pandemic restrictions and building construction, in lieu of the Annual Memorial Service for those beloved residents who have passed, our Memorial Garden Committee published a Remembrance Booklet dedicated to the memory of and listing the names of those who have passed in the last two years.
