## **Care Center Update:**

## Special Father's Day Event:

On Saturday, June 19, 2021 Dunwoody is hosting a special Father's Day Luncheon for all residents residing in the Care Center! Hot dogs, chips, cupcakes and beverages will be provided at no cost in the large tent in the Memorial Garden for all interested residents and visitors.

To participate: Please click on the Sign-Up Genius link on the Dunwoody web-site and choose an available time when you would like to schedule your visit.

Times available: Saturday, June 19th are 11:00 A.M.- 12:30 P.M. and 1:00 P.M.- 2:30 P.M. By scheduling a visit on Sign Up Genius you will have a table reserved for your party at that time. A maximum of (4) visitors per scheduled group will be allowed. Children are allowed so long as they are able to practice social-distancing and must remain masked in common areas.

Protocol: Report to the Care Center main entrance. You will be screened for signs and symptoms of Covid-19, including a temperature check. After screening, you may proceed to the resident's room and assist the resident to the Memorial Garden tent. Staff will be available to assist with transport to and from the Memorial Garden tent if requested.

Masks are not required if you are seated at a table, but we ask that you wear a mask anytime that you leave the table and/or when you are moving through common areas such as hallways.

In addition to this special Father's Day event, you are welcome to sign up for regular visits in a resident's room. Use Sign-Up Genius on the Dunwoody web-site.

Room visits are limited to two visitors, no children under age 18. No food or beverage allowed. You are welcome to take the resident you are visiting outdoors. The Care Center's outdoor visiting area is located in the parking lot just East of the Care Center main entrance. Tables and chairs and covered; seating is available in this area on a first-come, first-serve basis. If you have questions, please contact your social worker or Care Center Admissions. On behalf of everyone at Dunwoody we would like to wish all dads a very Happy Father's Day.

## **Construction Update:**

On the east side of the project, the framer is installing exterior sheathing and the water-resistant membrane is being installed over the sheathing. The roofer is installing shingles on the roof and beginning to "dry in" the flat roof areas. Inside the building the mason is working on interior masonry walls, and work on the elevator pit continues.

On the west side the of the addition, trusses and sheathing are being installed at the roof. Steel stairs are being installed in the stair tower. Drywall is being hung inside of the west country connector hallway, as well as temporary lighting, fire alarm, and handrails in preparation for opening it for resident use.

Additionally, we have approved our contractors to be able to remove their masks outside on the construction site if fully vaccinated. Masks are still required indoors for all contractors. As part of this agreement, Warfel has agreed that no lost days will be incurred if a COVID-19 outbreak was identified at the site.
