One case resident living in <u>residential living</u> was identified as positive for COVID-19. That resident is in isolation in their residence and doing well; several close contacts of that residents were swabbed and in quarantine as is Dunwoody's protocol. All residence have been given written guidance related to their specific circumstances. If no further cases are identified in <u>skilled nursing</u> today, we will once again welcome visitors on Saturday September 25, 2021. Please be reminded that outside visitation is preferred as is recommended by the CDC, CMS and DOH. This weekend looks to be especially beautiful for outdoor visits!

One staff member working in <u>Personal Care on Cedars East</u> was identified as positive for COVID-19. While at work on Wednesday, September 22, 2021, they were notified by a family member that they had been a close contact of someone positive for COVID 19. They notified their supervisor and tested positive for COVID-19. Cedars East is now under outbreak protocols and will welcome visitors on Thursday, October 7, 2021 if no other positive cases are identified.

This is a huge step for our campus and our community. Area Power Shutdown for 9/28:

A POWER SHUTDOWN is scheduled for apartments A, B, J, and the West Country Houses on Tuesday Sept 28th. It is planned to start at 9 am, and the intent is to have power return by 11 am. Flu Shots/Booster Shots:

Health & Wellness has 30 doses of flu vaccine left. Call to schedule an appointment in H+W Monday thru Friday. Please notify us if you've received your shot at an outside location. Flu shots were given to residents in Skilled Nursing and Personal Care today. We are currently planning our distribution process for COVID-19 Booster Vaccinations and will share that shortly. Dr. Lawrence recommends 2 weeks between receiving the flu vaccine and the COVID-19 booster.

Gift Shop

The Gift Shop will relocate to Apt C 223 the first week of October to accommodate dining seating.

Residential Living Dining

Indoor dining will begin Tuesday Oct 12th. Tent service will stop after dinner Monday Oct 11th. Dinner seating will be available in the Auditorium, Gift Shop, and Lobby Lounge. Food stations will be set up buffet style outside the Auditorium with service beginning at 5 p.m. When 7:30pm programs are scheduled, please plan to arrive at dinner by 6:10 p.m. so clean up can occur before the programs begin. China, glassware, and silverware will return. The Village Grill To-Go and Terrace Dining Room service will continue to open at 5:30 p.m. On Saturday nights pre-Covid and Construction the Terrace D.R. was closed. The Lincoln Dining Room was open for waited service. Resident participation on Saturday nights for indoor dining is usually lower than the rest of the week. Having one dining open was sufficient. This may return starting Saturday October 16th. You will receive advance notice.

Guest Apartments:

We are welcoming back our one-bedroom guest apartment beginning 9/24/21. Reservations will begin on Monday 9/20/21 on our website – www.dunwoody.org. The cost of the one-bedroom rental is \$125 per night. Please contact Debbie Sabin at 610-723-4626 if you need any assistance. Please remember that all guests using the guest apartments need to be fully vaccinated to stay on campus. The guest will need to show proof of vaccination at check in. Now all 3 guest rooms are available for rental.

Newspapers/Lounge Area:

Each day, Dunwoody provides 4 newspapers for shared resident use: 2 Inquirers, 1 New York Times, and 1 Wall Street Journal. After delivery, our front desk receptionist places the newspapers in the new Lounge Area (the area of the original reception desk). Please enjoy reading the paper while in that area, but please do not remove any of the papers intended for shared use. Thank you!

Construction Update:

The exterior finishes have begun to be applied on the side of the building closest to the apartments. Once this side is complete, finishes will continue around the building on the south and then east elevations. The excavator continues to tie in roof drains and grade around the building as well. Most framing in the building is complete, and lights, as well as other rough ins are being installed in preparation for hanging drywall, scheduled for early November. Roof blocking and mechanical curbs will be installed on the roof, in order to be ready for the flat roof insulation and membrane.
