This year we are celebrating 39 employees with Milestone Anniversaries! Please join me in wishing them Happy Anniversary and congratulating them on their impressive length of service! Together they represent 640 years of service. We are so proud of their achievement! Whether it be 5, 10, 20 or 30 years, the contribution that they make each day and each year is critically important. The Board of Directors, our Leadership Team and our residents and families acknowledge that Dunwoody Village benefits from their service and commitment. Health and Wellness

Dr. Lawrence, along with Dr. Gilbert, Director of Infectious Disease at MLH, is recommending that residents residing in CCRC environments should mask in public areas. The Delaware County Covid positivity rate increased from 7.8% to 8.9% week-over-week, 11/30- 12/7. Lancaster County is in the 18+% range and most counties are faring worse than Delaware County. He said about a fourth of the cases MLH is seeing are breakthrough cases. The number of flu and RSV cases are also increasing quickly. Dunwoody has had confirmed cases of the flu and RSV in the Care Center over the last 2 weeks. We strongly recommend only hosting vaccinated guests on campus and only visiting with vaccinated family and friends during this holiday season.

Please notify the Wellness Center immediately if you have had close contact or if you are symptomatic and remain in your residence. Our protocol is to require residents with close contact with someone with confirmed COVID-19 to quarantine in their residence. After 2 negative lab (PCR) tests and after review by Dr. Lawrence, residents may leave quarantine and move freely about our campus. During quarantine, residents may not visit common spaces on campus, but they may leave campus. Residents who are positive for COVID 19 must remain in isolation for 10 days from symptom onset, and until they are symptom free. They should not leave their residence nor should they leave campus.

The pool will be closed from December 20, 2021 thru December 27, 2021 for repairs that were delayed due to material delays.

EMPLOYEE HEALTH

Employee Booster Clinics are scheduled January 20, February 3 and 24, March 17 and 31. The clinics will be held from 1:00-4:00. Any employee who received a COVID booster or Flu vaccine off campus should provide proof to Human Resources. We are strongly encouraging receiving the flu vaccine as flu activity in our region is high and we already have had confirmed cases of the flu on campus.

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

The removal of Conestoga Stone on the West Elevation will not begin until after the holidays. It is anticipated it will take approximately one month to hand chisel the stone off and then replace it with the correct system. Warfel is working on a dust remediation plan for that process. On the exterior of the building, the main focus continues to be getting the roof completed. In addition, stone masons continue to work on the south side of the building, installing the stone veneer. Inside the building, drywall work is happening on both floors. The auditorium and some adjacent areas are sanded smooth, and the painter is beginning to prime those areas. Wood trim is beginning next week. In other areas, drywall is still being hung and will be finished and primed in the coming weeks.
