# Dear Residents, Families and Staff:



The cold weather has arrived and it definitely looks and feels like winter outside. Dress in layers and stay warm! We have a planned electrical outage on Tuesday, January 18, 2022. This outage is necessary to tie in the electrical in our new construction. Below you will find information on the shutdown. Residents and Families from the Care Center will receive a separate letter with more detailed information on the Power Shutdown.

Please note, residents are asked to continue to wear masks in the common areas of Dunwoody Village through Monday January 31<sup>st</sup>. We will be re-evaluating the health of our campus on January 26<sup>th</sup> and will share any new information in the January 27<sup>th</sup> memo. Thank you for your ongoing compliance and support as we move through this situation.

### **ELECTRICAL POWER SHUTDOWN**

On January 18<sup>th</sup>, 2022, Dunwoody Village will have a power shutdown to tie in the new building. The shutdown will be from 9am-5pm. All Apartments, Country Houses, and Penrose homes will <u>not</u> lose **power. The areas that are going to be affected are the lobby (including the elevator), the auditorium, the kitchen, Leeland, Woodlea, and Dundale West.** More information will be provided for the Care Center residents and families that will be affected by the shutdown. Fitness will be canceled for this day as the auditorium will have no power. Coffee and meal changes for the day are listed in the dining update. ### **DINING PRESENTATION CHANGE OF DATE**

### **RESIDENT ACTIVITIES**

- Religious Service in the auditorium scheduled for Sunday, January 23, 2022 is cancelled.
- The Resale Shop remains closed and is currently scheduled to reopen on Monday, January 24<sup>th</sup>.
- Thursday Mah Jong in the Club Room has been cancelled. Mah Jong will resume the first week of March, on Thursday, March 3<sup>rd</sup>.
- Dominoes is cancelled until further notice.

The trip to the <u>Philadelphia Orchestra</u> for tomorrow, Friday, January 14<sup>th</sup> is still scheduled as planned. The bus will begin boarding at 12:15 pm.

## **CONSTRUCTION UPDATE**

On the west side of the building, stone removal is underway. Once the stone is removed, the substrate will be inspected for damage and the stone reinstalled. The installation of the ductwork placed on the roof is ongoing as well. Inside the building, drywall finishing continues on the lower level. On the upper-level, paint and trim are ongoing and ceiling grid installation continues. Ceramic tile in the upper bathrooms is starting this week.

### HEALTH & WELLNESS

As of today, Thursday, January 13, 2022, we have 4 positive cases of COVID in Residential Living, all are doing well and quarantining in their units. As the region continues to experience a spike in COVID-19 positive cases, residents are required to wear masks in all common areas thru Monday January 31<sup>st</sup>. The mask requirement will be re-evaluated on January 26, 2022 and new information will be shared on January 27th. Please notify the Wellness Center immediately if you have had close contact to someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 or if you are symptomatic and please, remain in your residence. Our Wellness team will provide testing and guidance.

No fitness classes on January 18<sup>th</sup>, 2022 due to the power shutdown. The Fitness Committee met for the first time since the pandemic on Wednesday to discuss the new fitness center.

### EMPLOYEE HEALTH

Employee Booster Clinics are scheduled January 20, February 3 and 24, March 17 and 31. The clinics will be held from 1:00-4:00. Any employee who received a COVID booster or Flu vaccine off campus should provide proof to Human Resources.

### CARE CENTER UPDATE

#### Covid-19

Delaware County continues to be an area of "high-risk" Covid-19 transmission. Three residents residing in Skilled have tested positive for COVID-19. For Personal Care, there are currently 2 residents who tested positive on Cedars East, 6 residents on Cedars West, and 1 resident on Leeland. There are currently no confirmed cases on Woodlea.

### Visitation

Visitors are welcome, but Dunwoody strongly discourages visitation by unvaccinated individuals. If you do plan to visit, please remember that masks are required at all times. Please check our website for visitation requirements and guidelines.
