COVID-19 Update

One resident from Dundale West has tested positive for COVID-19. One Leeland resident, 1 Woodlea resident, and 7 Cedars West residents have tested positive for COVID-19 on 1/3/2022.

Visitation

Dunwoody village strongly discourages unvaccinated individuals to visit due to increased risk to themselves and our residents. Visitors are welcome, but please check our website for visitation guidelines which include masking at all times during the visit.

Health and Wellness

Residents are asked to wear a mask in common areas through January 16th. We strongly recommend only hosting vaccinated guests on campus and only visiting with vaccinated family and friends as the region experiences post-holiday season spikes in positive cases.

Please notify the Wellness Center immediately if you have had close contact to someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 or if you are symptomatic and please, remain in your residence. The Wellness Center will provide testing but know that due to the high volume of testing, wait time for results has been delayed by several days. The Wellness Center team will also provide guidance for your quarantine.

Employee Health

Employee Booster Clinics are scheduled January 20, February 3 and 24, March 17 and 31 from 1pm to 4pm. Flu shots are available. Please inform Human Resources if you have received the COVID booster or flu vaccine off campus. We are strongly encouraging employees to receive the flu vaccine as flu activity in our region is high and we have had confirmed cases of flu on campus.

Construction Update:

Weather permitting, stone remediation will begin on the West Elevation on Friday, January 7th. In areas affected, plantings will be covered with plywood, and windows, sidewalks and driveways will be protected. Tarps and plastic will be used to help control dust, and sprinklers will spray down dust as needed. Timeline provided by Warfel is approximately 5 business days for stone removal once work begins. Reinstallation of stone will be approximately 10 business days; may be 10 additional days if foam board and/or liquid applied need to be replaced. We will be inspecting the work daily with Warfel and Bernardon, and we will provide notification if additional work days become necessary. When finished, the West Elevation will look exactly as it does now, with the beautiful Conestoga stone providing visual design and interest. The roofing for Phase I is nearly complete, and ductwork for the mechanical systems is being installed on the roof and tied into the units that were installed last week. Inside the building, the majority of drywall is hung. As areas of drywall are finished, wood trim and paint are ongoing. The ceiling grid for the acoustic ceiling tile areas has started.
