

Dear Residents, Families and Staff:

Thank you for your patience as we worked through the Power Outage on Wednesday 19th. The weather cooperated and the construction team completed the electrical tie in quickly and power was restored between 1 and 1:30pm. We are planning for two more outages. Because the weather looks to be too cold next week, we will not plan a shutdown. We will provide notification and further information when we have confirmed dates. The power and gas shutdown may happen on the same week if the weather conditions look good so we do not impact our building schedule.

FREE COVID-19 TEST KITS

The Postal Service is delivering one shipment of 4 COVID tests per residential address. Enter your name, address and email at http://www.usps.com/covidtest to request a shipment. For those who don't have access to a computer or an internet connection, the government has also set up a phone line. For now, that number is the same number as the government's vaccine hotline: 1-800-232-0233. This number is the only option for ordering the federal government's free tests without visiting the online portal. You cannot pick up tests in person at a local post office.

KN-95 MASKS AT THE GIFT SHOP

The Dunwoody Village Gift Shop has ordered a supply of KN-95 masks made in the United States. Residents will not need to purchase an entire box. Masks will be sold individually at our cost of \$2.00 each. The order is expected to arrive next week and we will let you know as soon as they arrive. Dunwoody does not require a KN-95 mask for residents at this time.

HEALTH & WELLNESS

As of today, Thursday, January 20th, we have 2 positive cases of COVID-19 in Residential Living. Residents are required to wear masks in all common areas thru Monday January 31st. The mask requirement will be re-evaluated on January 26, 2022 and new information will be shared on January 27th. Please notify the Wellness Center immediately if you have had close contact to someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 or if you are symptomatic and please, remain in your residence. Our Wellness team will provide testing and guidance.

CARE CENTER UPDATE

Covid-19:

Delaware County continues to be an area of "high-risk" COVID-19 transmission. Two residents residing in Skilled Nursing, 2 residing on Cedars East and 2 residing on Cedars West all have tested positive for COVID-19. There are currently no confirmed cases on Leeland or Woodlea. We anticipate that Personal Care residents who are COVID positive will be removed from isolation and "Red level" precautions and return to regular activities on January 21st.

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

On the west side of the building, the stone mason continues to replace the stone veneer. The roofer continues to work on miscellaneous remaining details, and the HVAC contractor is hooking up the rooftop equipment. Inside the building, many areas are first-coated with paint, and ceiling grid is being installed. As ceiling grid is placed, lights, sprinkler heads, and HVAC grilles are installed into place as well. There is still some ongoing drywall finishing in the west country hallway.
