Dear Residents, Staff and Families,

Effective immediately, residents residing in Residential Living have the option to wear masks in common areas; masks are no longer required in common areas of the Village. Masks are required in all areas of the Care Center, including Skilled Nursing and Personal Care. Please be reminded that there are residents who need to, or choose to, wear a mask. We must support each other and respect each other's needs and opinions regarding masking and infection control. All guests/visitors are required to wear masks in common areas in Residential Living and in the Care Center. The decision to lift the mask requirement in Residential Living Common Areas was made by the leadership team based on the consistently low number of cases on campus and the continuing improvement in the community. Both Dr. Thomas Lawrence, Dunwoody's Medical Director, as well as Dr. Brett Gilbert, Director of Infectious Disease at MLH, recommend that residents residing in CCRC's still wear a mask in public areas.

Covid-19 Update

Although Delaware County continues to be an area of "high-risk", the COVID-19 positivity rate continues to decline week-over-week. There are currently 3 resident cases of COVID-19; one in personal care and one in residential living. We have no staff cases.

Care Center Visitation

Visitors are welcome but Dunwoody Village strongly discourages unvaccinated individuals to visit due to increased risk to themselves and our residents. Residents may have (2) visitors at a time. Visitors must wear a mask at all times when visiting, including while in resident rooms. No food or beverages is to be consumed by visitors while visiting. Children ages 6 and up are permitted to visit so long as they can properly wear a mask and follow infection control precautions. Children ages 5 and under are allowed to visit through pre-approved compassionate visits, which can be scheduled through Jackie DelVecchio or Beth Powers at: (610) 359-4504. Both skilled and personal care residents are permitted to visit relatives and friends off-site, in their homes. Taking residents off-site to crowded places is highly discouraged. If a resident is not staying the night off-site, they will not be required to quarantine upon return. If a resident chooses to stay over-night off-site, they will be required to quarantine until the resident receives two negative Covid-19 tests. The first test will be administered on the day of the resident's return and the second test will be done on day 5 of their return from the over-night visit.

Health and Wellness

Please notify the Wellness Center immediately if you have had an exposure or if you are symptomatic; and please, remain in your residence. Our protocol is to require residents with close contact exposure with someone with confirmed COVID-19 to quarantine in their residence. After 2 negative lab (PCR) tests and after review by Dr. Lawrence, residents may leave quarantine and move freely about our campus. During quarantine, residents may not visit common spaces on campus, but they may leave campus. Residents who are positive for COVID 19 must remain in isolation for 10 days from symptom onset, and until they are symptom free. They should not leave their residence nor should they leave campus.

Construction

The main focus on the job continues to be getting ceilings and trims completed so that flooring can start. Wood trim, electrical devices, cabinets, HVAC grilles, and decorative light fixtures are currently being installed. Ceramic tile flooring in the salon, bathrooms, and bistro is complete, and epoxy flooring in the kitchens is in progress now.
