Dear Residents, Families & Staff,

It was wonderful to celebrate the opening of Hearthside and the auditorium with residents from the Care Center on Wednesday. Dining Service provided a delicious lunch in Hearthside as residents enjoyed the amazing view and socialized with friends. Residents were invited into our auditorium to enjoy the beautiful music of *Touch of Blues*. It was a shining example of One Dunwoody as residents, staff and board members celebrated together.

Last week 50 staff members attended the first of two Montessori trainings as we begin to incorporate this philosophy into our culture and our model of care. Staff will be engaged in 1 year of training, education and mentoring. Montessori is familiar to many as a method of teaching children; however, it is also an evidence-based approach with elders and those with cognitive impairment. Montessori philosophy reinforces: respect of the person, independence, meaningful work and roles, and learning and engagement. The goal is to capitalize on one's strengths and abilities as care partners consider the individual's values, preferences and life goals. Montessori fosters a culture of autonomy, enablement and self-determination. More information on Montessori at Dunwoody will be shared in the near future.

COVID-19 Update

At present, our Care Center currently has no residents who are positive for COVID. For resident safety, masks are mandatory while visiting the care center. Two Care Center staff members are at home on isolation with expectations to return on June 8th. There are 3 Residential residents on modified quarantine due to exposure.

Dr. Thomas Lawrence, our Medical Director, would like to remind residents that all cold symptoms should be reported to Health & Wellness. Additionally, if residents have symptoms or do not feel well, please stay home.

<u>Masks</u>

With no COVID-19 outbreak in Independent Living, masks for residents are currently optional in the common areas. This is subject to change based on COVID cases on campus. Masks are required by all residents when entering Health & Wellness or when visiting the Care Center. <u>Visitors and guests are required to wear masks in the common areas.</u>
