# Dunwoody Village Seal Coating of Parking Lots Schedule

Beginning Saturday August 5<sup>th</sup>, Dunwoody Village blacktop will be paved. This means parking will be restricted and driving will be restricted in certain areas on certain days. Cars may need to be moved the night before the paving occurs, since they will begin in the early morning. Please do not park, drive, nor walk in areas that are restricted. Traveling through a restricted, newly paved area will damage the blacktop, damage your car, damage your shoes and damage the flooring in Dunwoody Village. Please contact Fran Meehan, Grounds, if you have questions about the schedule.

## Saturday, August 5th

Staff Parking Lot C and Care Center overflow will be closed for paving. Additional parking will be available in Visitor Lot near the Care Center (Lot D).

## Monday, August 7th

We will be seal coating parking lot at Door 4 to Door 5, including carports. One lane at East Entrance\* (near schoolhouse) will be closed. Main Entrance\* will be open. Cars should be moved to Construction Lot/extra parking across from Doors 5 and 6. Please move cars the night before.

#### Tuesday, August 8th

Main Entrance\* will be closed. One-half of Dunwoody Drive\* and Visitor Lot A will be closed. Temporary traffic lights will be in place to help control traffic to Door 1 (Front Circle), Village Apartments and West Country Houses. All traffic diverted to East Entrance\* for entering and exiting the property.

## Wednesday, August 9th

Remainder of Staff Lot (near the barn) and other half of Dunwoody Drive\*, including bus path and additional visitor parking spaces, will be seal coated. Parking will be available in Visitor Lots A and D, Construction Lot, and Staff Parking.

#### Thursday, August 10th

Care Center Lot to be closed. Dunwoody Drive\* (if turning left) from Main Entrance\* will also be closed. Parking lot from Door 5 to Door 7-8 will be closed. Cars in Lots 5, 7, and 8 should be moved to construction lot overflow, Visitor Lot A, or Staff Lot. Access to Penrose, the East Country Houses, and employee lot will be through the East Entrance\* (near the schoolhouse). Please move cars the night before. Carports will also be seal coated.

# Friday, August 11th

Front circle of Main Building and parking lot leading to it (J parking) will be closed for the day. Please move your car to additional parking at Door 6-7. Access to Main Entrance\* will be through the visitor lot (A) walkway or door 4. One lane of the East Entrance\* (schoolhouse) and Visitor Lot D will be closed. Staff can use Staff Parking Lot C and additional parking areas.

#### \*Key for Locations

The East Entrance is the road near the schoolhouse.

Main Entrance is with the light and across from Bryn Mawr Avenue.

Dunwoody Drive is the main road between the Care Center and Main Building.
